<p>Swift</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medium sized aerial bird, makes a shrill screaming call in flight. • Present from April to August. • Similar to house martin and swallow. • Breeds in building roofs, especially older ones. 	<p>House sparrow</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Often in small flocks, they are noisy and make chirping and chirruping sounds. • Seen all year round. • Similar to tree sparrow. • Found in towns, villages, parks and gardens.
<p>Lapwing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medium to large bird, prominent large crest on head. Rounded wings in flight. • Seen all year round. Flocks in winter. • Similar to golden plover. • Found on farmland, open areas with short vegetation and wetland areas. 	<p>Yellowhammer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Small, sparrow-sized yellow bird. • Seen all year round. • Similar to greenfinch. • Found on mixed farmland, in cereal fields, hedges, farmyards and cereal stubble fields.

*Enjoy recording whilst taking care to avoid disturbance to wildlife.
Relevant access permission should always be sought prior to visiting any sites.*
